#### Dances Sacree' et Profane: WAGO programs for October and November

I love fall. There is nothing like the changing beauty of this part of Virginia that affects my mood more than walks on the beautiful colored leaf trails near my home, smelling crisp, frosty mornings, or sampling apple butter on a hot biscuit. It is good thinking time. And, in a way, we are preparing to say, goodbye as the seasons change. There is a tug between so many opposites: brilliant-colored trees-dull decomposing leaves, shorter days-longer nights, and foolish spooks – saintly souls. In October, I get excited seeing the season's decorations for Halloween: the ghostly goblins that are draped all over our lawns surrounded by bright orange pumpkins. In November, our liturgical season closes Pentecost, and we sober up by honoring those who have passed on with the celebration of the All Saints' Feast Day. It reminds me of Debussy's *Dances Sacree' et Profane*. This work was commissioned in 1904 for the new chromatic harp. It takes two contrasting dance themes and weaves them back and forth creating one work. Its "new" impressionistic style allowed for much more dissonance with the creative use of the whole tone scale and chromaticism. We listen to one composition that twists and turns. It is a celebration of how tensions in music make it the most satisfying. Your WAGO Chapter programs are one way to blend both.

For October and November. WAGO has two very exciting programs with guest performers. Please plan now to come and join our community guests. Both programs are going to continue our collection of donations to community programs—the WAGO does its blending of fine music with good charity. On Friday, October 25, we welcome Dr. Wayne Wold with Marilyn Shenenberger and Terry Sisk in a performance of spooky music for the organ. Our host is Market Street UMC (the corner of Cork and Cameron streets). The concert will start at 7:00 PM. It is free (costumes optional!) but we will continue to collect donations for WATTS and The Winchester Rescue Mission. This is a good "bring your guest" program.

In November, we invited Caritas NoVA, an elite professional women's ensemble in a program called *The Bountiful Earth*. This group will be in concert at Trinity Episcopal Church, Upperville on Sunday, November 10 at 3:00 PM. The concert is free but will collect donations for the Warren Couty 4-H program. A rich program of pieces for women, many by women composers, will explore how the earth has guided and shaped our evolution. We will find out just how much we are made of earth's elements: ashes to ashes, dust to dust,

We've had plenty of business to attend but as our most recent Fall Board Meeting proved, our members are at their best when sharing something they are excited about. It has taken me a very long time to write this message to our members. Yet, I have had a growing feeling that this tension that has been growing in me is a gift with a purpose. This past week I was looking for that special bit of wisdom as I scrolled through endless postings on Facebook. I stopped at a small poem titled *Remember Me*. The coincidence is that a similar text, a poem by Mary Elizabeth Frye, and a choral arrangement by Eleanor Daley will be featured as the final piece on the Caritas NoVA program.






**Caritas NoVA Mission**

- Ability to collaborate and work in a collegial and creative manner with ministerial staff and members of the choir.
- Previous experience as church organist is a plus. We are seeking a candidate with curiosity and openness to learning new music from a variety of traditions.
- Willingness to participate in continuing education.

#### **Responsibilities - Organist**

- Accompany all choirs and soloists in rehearsals.
- Provides accompaniment at weekly choir rehearsals.
- Provides organ or piano accompaniments during services for choir and/or soloists anthems, collaborations with the handbell choir, or other musicians as needed.
- Prepares music for special services and occasions, including but not limited to: Advent and Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Lent and Easter, Pentecost, funerals, and weddings.
- The Organist shall be available whenever possible for funerals and weddings and retains the right of first refusal for those services.
- Arranges for a supply organist for all worship service absences. Informs Minister of Music and Senior Adults of absences in a timely manner, the exception being for illness and emergencies. Provides a replacement accompanist if required for weekly choir rehearsals.
- Communicates effectively and thoroughly with the music ministry.


#### **Position Overview:**


